The program emphasizes the role of parents as their child's first and most important teacher and builds relationships with families to support:

- * family well-being and positive parent-child relationships;
- * families as learners and lifelong educators;
- * family engagement in transitions;
 - family connections to peers and community; and
- * families as advocates and leaders.

EDUCATION: Parents and

teachers work together to provide developmental preschool experiences for physical, language, social, literacy, math, science, social studies, the arts and technology. Children learn through play and direct instruction.

HEALTH: We work with parents so each child has a doctor and dentist and is up-to-date with exams and immunizations. We teach health and safety in the classroom. USDA approved meals are served.

SOCIAL SERVICES: Families

make decisions about the community services they choose to use. Services may include housing, GED, public assistance, counseling, emergency assistance, food stamps, special education, parenting classes, and more.

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT: The

whole family is involved when a child is in Head Start. Parents help in the classroom and on field trips. They attend parent activities, workshops, and serve on Policy Council. Parents help the program continue when they volunteer time and service.

Head Start services are designed to be responsive to each child and family's ethnic, cultural and linguistic heritage.

WHO CAN BE IN HEAD START?

Children 3 and 4 on or before September 1, including those with disabilities.

Eligibility is based on family income at or below the poverty level.

Families with other situations including homelessness, children in foster care, or receiving TANF also are eligible.
